The Lord continued to appear at Shiloh, and there he revealed himself to Samuel through his word.

Qu: Given what we have reflected on, how would you answer your friends question, if asked again?

Qu: If the Bible is about revealing God's glory, how should this shape our prayers as we approach the Bible?

Read through this passage from Mark and then consider the following questions

Mark 7:5-13

⁵So the Pharisees and teachers of the law asked Jesus, 'Why don't your disciples live according to the tradition of the elders instead of eating their food with defiled hands?' ⁶He replied, 'Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites; as it is written: "These people honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. ⁷ They worship me in vain; their teachings are merely human rules." ⁸You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions.' ⁹And he continued, 'You have a fine way of setting aside the commands of God in order to observe your own traditions! ¹⁰For Moses said, "Honour your father and mother," and, "Anyone who curses their father or mother is to be

put to death." ¹¹But you say that if anyone declares that what might have been used to help their father or mother is Corban (that is, devoted to God) - ¹²then you no longer let them do anything for their father or mother. ¹³Thus you nullify the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And you do many things like that.'

In this passage we are thinking about "Words of God" vs "Words about God".

In this passage, what does Jesus say the Words of God tell us about honouring our Mother and Qu: Father? Whereas, what do the words "about God" (those the Pharisees upheld) say people can do?

What does Jesus' attitude reveal about how we should treat Words of God? Qu:

Qu: Where might we read words about God? What important thing does this passage imply we should do?

Qu: Even though it was written by Moses, does Jesus think the Old Testament is words of God, or words about God? Why is this encouraging for us?
